

Ms Fahy and the children of 6th class recently attended 'Crossing Lines', an exhibition focussed on the themes of protest and dissent in the


Highlanes Gallery, Drogheda. The children received a guided tour of the exhibition.

#### Christmas at Last by Ellen Tumulty


The crash of bottles, the crunch of tins,
