at the University of Turku in Finland and is a highly sought after initiative.

The KiVa programme has been evaluated in numerous studies and has been proved to be highly effective. Because bullying is a group phenomenon, the main aim of the program is to prevent bullying before it happens by influencing the group norms and building capacity in all the children to behave in constructive ways, to take responsibility for not encouraging bullying, and to support their vulnerable peers. In addition to being preventive. KiVa is also interventive with clear guidelines to tackle bullying when it does take place.

All staff members will be receiving intensive KiVa training. Parents will be required to attend an information evening in September. It is essential that all families support this initiative.
