As always, we appreciate your cooperation with regard to our uniform policy here at Scoil Mhuire gan Smál.


Active Schools


Tennis coaching with our Dundalk Tennis Club coach Gary Rodriguez is ongoing for Junior and Senior Infants and 5th and 6th Class.
